Each year, the Delaware Symphony Orchestra hosts *Educators Night* to honor our area educators. Also provide two ADDITIONAL letters of recommendation from persons other than yourself. Finally, include a maximum of five pieces of support materials that further illuminate the candidate's strengths and demonstrate his/her qualifications.
